PRELIMINARY MONTHLY TRAFFIC AND CAPACITY STATISTICS AUGUST 2013

Summary of Traffic and Capacity Statistics

Month of August 2013

Qantas Group passenger numbers for August 2013 increased by 0.5 per cent from the previous year. Group Available Seat Kilometres (ASKs) increased by 0.2 per cent and Revenue Passenger Kilometres (RPKs) decreased by 0.8 per cent, resulting in a revenue seat factor of 77.6 per cent which was 0.8 percentage points lower than the previous year.

ASKs and passengers carried for Qantas Domestic (excluding QantasLink) were lower in the month, mainly due to the moderation of capacity growth compared to the prior corresponding period.

Financial Year 2014

Qantas Group passenger numbers for the financial year to date (August 2013) increased by 1.2 per cent from the previous year. Group ASKs decreased by 0.1 per cent and RPKs decreased by 0.7 per cent, resulting in a revenue seat factor of 78.7 per cent which was 0.5 percentage points lower than the previous year.

For the financial year to date, Qantas Group yields were lower than the prior corresponding period, reflecting continued challenging market conditions. Total Domestic (comprising Qantas Domestic, QantasLink and Jetstar Domestic) yields were lower as a result of market capacity growth from the prior corresponding period and weaker demand in the leisure and regional segments.

Qantas International yields were lower than the prior corresponding period due to continued competitor capacity growth and an increase in Qantas International's available capacity to Asia resulting from the transfer of Qantas' European hub to Dubai.

Recent Developments

On 25 September 2013, the Jetstar Group welcomed the decision of the Competition Commission of Singapore allowing coordination between Jetstar-branded airlines across the Asia Pacific region. This follows the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission's approval on 26 March 2013.

On 25 September 2013, Qantas and the Tasmanian Government announced a \$4.35 million tourism cooperative agreement to promote Tasmania internationally and within Australia. The deal with Tasmania takes the total joint investment in tourism by Qantas within various Australian States and Territories to \$60 million over three years.

On 19 September 2013, Qantas announced QantasLink's upgraded Boeing 717 jets with Business Class and in-flight entertainment for all passengers will be deployed on all flights between Hobart and Sydney/Melbourne from mid-2014.

On 13 September 2013, Jetstar announced it will be the anchor tenant in Melbourne Airport's new domestic terminal, Terminal 4. Operations from the new terminal are expected to launch in 2015.

On 11 September 2013, Qantas and the Western Australian Government signed a \$7.65 million, three-year agreement to market and promote the State, targeting visitors from the UK, US, Singapore and Australia.

On 4 September 2013, Jetstar Asia announced an additional 18 weekly services from Singapore to popular destinations in Cambodia, Indonesia and China with the addition of two new aircraft to its fleet.
