# **Summary of Traffic and Capacity Statistics**

### Month of February 2010

February Group (comprising Qantas Domestic, QantasLink, Jetstar Domestic, Qantas International and Jetstar International) passenger numbers increased by 14.2 percent over the previous year. RPKs increased by 3.8 percent and ASKs were up 2.5 percent, resulting in a revenue seat factor of 79.4 percent, which was 1.0 percentage point higher than the previous year.

# Financial Year to Date February 2010

Group passenger numbers for the financial year to February 2010 were up 7.7 percent from the previous year. RPKs increased by 1.3 percent, while ASKs decreased by 1.3 percent, resulting in a revenue seat factor of 81.9 percent, which was 2.1 percentage points higher than the previous year.

Total Domestic (Qantas, QantasLink and Jetstar Domestic operations) yield excluding foreign exchange for the financial year to February 2010 was 5.1 percent lower when compared to the same period the prior year. Total International (Qantas and Jetstar International operations) yield excluding foreign exchange for the financial year to February 2010 decreased by 18.5 percent when compared to the same period the prior year.

Qantas international yields showed continued improvement with monthly yields moving from 7.7 percent lower versus the previous year in January, to 0.1 percent lower in February. Total International yield movements were adversely impacted by a change in the mix of flying with Jetstar representing a higher proportion of international ASKs.

Total Group yield excluding foreign exchange for the financial year to February 2010 was 10.3 percent lower when compared to the same period two years ago.

# **Recent Developments**

On 1 March, Qantas' second new A330-200 aircraft operated its first commercial service between Sydney and Melbourne.

On 2 March, Qantas announced the resignation of Qantas' Chief Financial Officer, Mr Colin Storrie, effective from 5 March

On 4 March, QantasLink announced it would increase services to Mackay and Rockhampton in Central Queensland from 6 April 2010.

# **Update on Hedging**

Qantas has hedged 87 percent of its expected fuel requirement in 2009/10 at a worst-case crude oil price of US\$88 per barrel including option premium. At current rates, Qantas has 78 percent participation in falling oil prices for the remainder of the year. Qantas has hedged 34 percent of its expected fuel requirement in 2010/11 at a worst-case crude oil price of US\$90 per barrel including option premium. At current rates, Qantas has 89 percent participation in falling oil prices for the year.
