Summary of Traffic and Capacity Statistics

Month of February 2013

Qantas Group passenger numbers for February 2013 were flat from the previous year. RPKs decreased by 4.9 per cent and ASKs decreased by 5.9 per cent, resulting in a revenue seat factor of 78.4 per cent, which was 0.8 percentage points higher than the previous year.

February 2012 was a leap year with the extra day increasing previous year comparisons by approximately 3.5 per cent.

Jetstar Asia passenger numbers were higher than prior corresponding period due to timing of Chinese New Year. Jetstar Asia ASKs and RPKs for the prior corresponding period include wide-body operations which were transferred from Jetstar Asia to Jetstar International from 1 July 2012.

Financial Year 2013

Qantas Group passenger numbers for the financial year to date (February 2013) were up 3.6 per cent from the previous year. RPKs decreased by 0.3 per cent, and ASKs increased by 0.2 per cent, resulting in a revenue seat factor of 80.1 per cent, which was 0.5 percentage point lower than the previous year.

For the financial year to date (February 2013), Qantas Group yields were lower than the prior corresponding period. Total Domestic (comprising Qantas Domestic, QantasLink and Jetstar Domestic) yields were lower than the prior corresponding period, largely due to increased capacity in the domestic market.

Recent Developments

On 27 March 2013, Qantas welcomed the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission's (ACCC) approval of its partnership with Emirates for a period of five years. The partnership will provide customers with a seamless international and Australian network, frequent flyer benefits and world-class travel experiences.

On 26 March 2013, the Jetstar Group welcomed the final determination of the ACCC approving coordination between Jetstar-branded airlines across the Asia Pacific region. The decision is an important step in enabling Jetstar Asia, Jetstar Japan, Jetstar Pacific and Jetstar Hong Kong to collaborate to deliver lower fares, a more expansive network and a singular customer experience.

On 14 March 2013, Jetstar Japan announced it will launch services to Matsuyama from Tokyo, increasing Jetstar Japan's destinations to nine. The service will commence in June 2013.

On 14 March 2013, Jetstar Pacific announced new flights from Ho Chi Minh City and Vinh to Buon Ma Thout. The services commenced on 26 March 2013.

On 5 March 2013, Qantas unveiled the expansion of the Qantas Club at Perth Airport. The extension is one of the many initiatives Qantas has introduced to improve customers' experience in Western Australia.

Update on Foreign Ownership

While not required under ASX Listing Rule 3.19, the Qantas Group confirms that the most recent reconciliation found the level of foreign ownership to be 39.8 per cent as at 6 March 2013. The Qantas Group remains subject to an aggregate foreign ownership limit of 49 per cent under the Qantas Sale Act.
