PRELIMINARY MONTHLY TRAFFIC AND CAPACITY STATISTICS MARCH 2007

Summary of Traffic and Capacity Statistics

Month of March 2007

March Group (comprising Qantas Domestic, QantasLink, Jetstar and Qantas International) passenger numbers increased by 8.3 per cent over the previous year. RPKs increased by 10.2 per cent, while ASKs were up 2.5 per cent, resulting in a revenue seat factor of 80.7 per cent, which was 5.6 percentage points higher than the previous year.

Financial Year to Date March 2007

Total Domestic (Qantas, QantasLink and Jetstar domestic operations) yield excluding exchange for the financial year to March 2007 increased by 4.3 per cent when compared to the same period last year. Total International (Qantas and Jetstar international operations) yield excluding exchange increased by 8.6 per cent over the same period.

Group passenger numbers for the financial year to March 2007 increased by 7.3 per cent from the previous year. RPKs increased by 7.6 per cent, while ASKs increased by 3.3 per cent, resulting in a revenue seat factor of 80.6 per cent, 3.2 percentage points higher than the previous year.

Recent Developments

On 8 May 2007, the Qantas Board acknowledged Airline Partners Australia's (APA) statement that its current bid for Qantas would not proceed. Qantas Chairman Margaret Jackson, said the foremost priority of the Board and management now was the continuing successful operation of the company.

On 4 May 2007, Qantas announced that it had successfully completed the International Air Transport Association's Operational Safety Audit (IOSA) and achieved IOSA Registration. The IOSA programme is a global benchmark for airline safety and quality.

On 3 May 2007, Qantas announced that it would establish a new base in Cairns from September, following a decision to close its Australian Airlines operation. The Qantas Group would remain a major employer in Cains, continuing to directly employ more than 900 people.

On 2 May 2007, Qantas Freight said that it would operate a second freight terminal from an off-airport location in Sydney from June, 2007. The new terminal would allow Qantas Freight to meet customer demand for faster and more efficient services as import volumes continued to grow.

On 26 April 2007, Qantas signed an investment agreement with the State Capital Investment Corporation (SCIC), the investment holding arm of the Vietnamese Government, to purchase a 30 per cent stake in Pacific Airlines, Vietnam's second largest carrier. Qantas will partner with SCIC to manage this investment, with completion expected within the next few months. Qantas Group will work with Pacific Airlines and SCIC to develop a new business plan for the carrier, which currently operates a fleet of single-class B737-400 aircraft on domestic routes in Vietnam and international services between Vietnam and Taiwan. Pacific Airlines' strategy is to reposition itself as a low cost carrier and expand its operation both within Vietnam and internationally.
