Summary of Traffic and Capacity Statistics

Month of March 2010

March Group (comprising Qantas Domestic, QantasLink, Jetstar Domestic, Qantas International and Jetstar International) passenger numbers increased by 11.2 percent over the previous year. RPKs increased by 4.1 percent and ASKs were up 2.5 percent, resulting in a revenue seat factor of 79.5 percent, which was 1.2 percentage point higher than the previous year.

Total International (Qantas and Jetstar International operations) yield excluding foreign exchange for the month of March was positive when compared to the corresponding prior year period.

Financial Year to Date March 2010

Group passenger numbers for the financial year to March 2010 were up 8.1 percent from the previous year. RPKs increased by 1.6 percent, while ASKs decreased by 0.9 percent, resulting in a revenue seat factor of 81.6 percent, which was 2.0 percentage points higher than the previous year.

Total Domestic (Qantas, QantasLink and Jetstar Domestic operations) yield excluding foreign exchange for the financial year to March 2010 was 3.9 percent lower when compared to the corresponding prior year period. Total International (Qantas and Jetstar International operations) yield excluding foreign exchange for the financial year to March 2010 decreased by 16.2 percent when compared to the corresponding prior year period.

Total Group yield excluding foreign exchange for the financial year to March 2010 was 11.8 percent lower when compared to the same period two years ago*.

Recent Developments

Qantas' services to Europe were impacted during the month of April due to the closure of European airspace. Six supplementary flights operated throughout Australia, Asia and Europe. Qantas has now cleared the back load of passengers and will release the final financial impact shortly.

On 9 April, Qantas formally welcomed the commencement of A330 heavy maintenance at its Brisbane operation and introduced 21 new apprentice engineers who will join the 450-strong engineering workforce in Brisbane.

On 28 April Qantas launched new technology enabling domestic Mobile Check-in as part of its Next Generation Check-in initiative.

On 29 April Qantas announced that Qantas Frequent Flyer has reached seven million members and predicted ongoing solid growth over the foreseeable future.

Update on Hedging

Qantas has hedged 88 percent of its expected fuel requirement in 2009/10 at a worst-case crude oil price of US\$88 per barrel including option premium. At current rates, Qantas has 78 percent participation in falling oil prices for the remainder of the year. Qantas has hedged 37 percent of its expected fuel requirement in 2010/11 at a worst-case crude oil price of US\$91 per barrel including option premium. At current rates, Qantas has 89 percent participation in falling oil prices for the year.
