PRELIMINARY MONTHLY TRAFFIC AND CAPACITY STATISTICS MARCH 2013

Summary of Traffic and Capacity Statistics

Month of March 2013

Qantas Group passenger numbers for March 2013 increased by 2.1 per cent from the previous year. RPKs decreased by 2 per cent and ASKs decreased by 1.4 per cent, resulting in a revenue seat factor of 79.3 per cent, which was 0.6 percentage points lower than the previous year.

Financial Year 2013

Qantas Group passenger numbers for the financial year to date (March 2013) were up 3.4 per cent from the previous year. RPKs decreased by 0.5 per cent, and ASKs increased by 0.1 per cent, resulting in a revenue seat factor of 80 per cent, which was 0.5 percentage point lower than the previous year.

For the financial year to date (March 2013), Qantas Group yields were lower than the prior corresponding period. Total Domestic (comprising Qantas Domestic, QantasLink and Jetstar Domestic) yields were lower than the prior corresponding period, largely due to increased capacity in the domestic market.

Total International (comprising Qantas International and Jetstar International) yields were lower than the prior corresponding period due to increased competition and, as previously announced, the adverse impact of approximately \$50 million for the second half of financial year 2013 largely due to reduced selling prior to the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission granting interim approval of the Qantas Emirates partnership.

Qantas Loyalty Update

For the financial year to date (March 2013), billings for Qantas Frequent Flyer were in line with the prior corresponding period. External billings increased 3.5 per cent, offset by a 4.2 per cent decline in internal billings.

Recent Developments

On 22 April 2013, Qantas announced the issue of \$125 million in unsecured fixed rate notes maturing in April 2020. This transaction will not affect Qantas' overall debt position, with proceeds from the issue to be used to repay existing short term debt maturities. The Group's total liquidity position, including cash, cash equivalents and undrawn facilities, is expected to be between \$2.5 billion and \$3.0 billion as at 30 June 2013.

On 17 April 2013, Qantas announced its regional airline QantasLink will move into Qantas Domestic Terminal in Sydney, Terminal 3, in the second half of 2013. The repositioning of QantasLink's operation will allow seamless travel experiences for over one million customers each year.

On 11 April 2013, Qantas successfully refinanced a \$430 million term loan tranche of its \$1.28 billion unsecured, syndicated loan facility to April 2017. The syndication resulted in over-subscriptions that have been used to increase the term loan facility from \$430 million to \$550 million and to establish a \$230 million undrawn revolving loan facility maturing in April 2017.

On 8 April 2013, Qantas Frequent Flyer announced new Classic Award points pricing that allows members to book Jetstar flights for 20 per cent less. This enhancement also enables members to redeem points on destinations across Asia through the Jetstar Japan and Jetstar Asia networks.

On 3 April 2013, Qantas announced a significant expansion of its codeshare agreement with China Eastern Airlines, enabling customers better access to major cities in China through 17 direct Qantas or China Eastern services between Australia and mainland China each week.

On 29 March 2013, Qantas and Emirates welcomed the Competition Commission of Singapore's clearance of their partnership which launched on 31 March 2013.

On 28 March 2013, Qantas reached a new agreement with its International Cabin Crew. This is the fifteenth Enterprise Bargaining Agreement reached by Qantas since late 2011 and applies to around 3,400 customer service managers, customer service supervisors and flight attendants.
