PRELIMINARY MONTHLY TRAFFIC AND CAPACITY STATISTICS SEPTEMBER 2009

Summary of Traffic and Capacity Statistics

Month of September 2009

September Group (comprising Qantas Domestic, QantasLink, Jetstar Domestic, Qantas International and Jetstar International) passenger numbers increased by 6.6 percent over the previous year. RPKs increased by 2.7 percent and ASKs were down 2.0 percent, resulting in a revenue seat factor of 83.7 percent, which was 3.9 percentage points higher than the previous year.

Financial Year to Date September 2009

Group passenger numbers for the financial year to September 2009 were up 5.7 percent from the previous year. RPKs decreased by 0.3 percent, while ASKs decreased by 3.3 percent, resulting in a revenue seat factor of 82.4 percent, which was 2.5 percentage points higher than the previous year.

Total Domestic (Qantas, QantasLink and Jetstar Domestic operations) yield excluding foreign exchange for the financial year to September 2009 was 12.0 percent lower when compared to the same period the prior year. Total International (Qantas and Jetstar International operations) yield excluding foreign exchange for the financial year to September 2009 decreased by 24.2 percent when compared to the same period the prior year.

Yields this year to date have been impacted by the significant decline in corporate volumes and price discounting in all cabins driven by intense competition on key routes. The stronger economy cabin volume performance relative to premium cabin performance has accentuated the yield deterioration. Whilst there are improvements in trading conditions in some markets, the nature of booking patterns on most international routes, means that pricing and inventory actions tend to have longer lead times compared to domestic and other short haul routes.

Recent Developments

On 7 October, Qantas announced it would employ 100 engineering apprentices in February 2010, a \$28 million investment to support fleet growth and to skill its engineering business for the future.

Update on Hedging and Foreign Ownership

Qantas has hedged 85 percent of its expected fuel requirement in 2009/10 at a worst-case crude oil price of US\$88 per barrel including option premium. At current rates, Qantas has 78 percent participation in falling oil prices for the remainder of the year.

On 26 October, Qantas advised the market, based on a reconciliation that commenced on 30 September, that foreign persons have a relevant interest in 46.1 percent of Qantas shares.
